Written by: *Rodgers & Hammerstein* Music by: *Andreas Mitisek* Sung by: *Roberto Perlas Gomez - baritone* Carol and her older sister Allie grew up in Los Angeles where their father, Paul J Howard, a self-made landscape designer, developed an extensive horticultural business that began on 20 acres in Santa Fe Springs in the early 1900's and expended to the Paul J Howard Horticultural Nurseries and California Flowerland Nurseries throughout the LA area.

Carol graduated from the Marlborough High School in Los Angeles and went off to Scripps College, East of Los Angeles, but in the grim climate of WWII decided this was not for her and she opted instead for secretarial school.

In the early 1950's, armed with practical training, a curious mind, innate organizational skills and healthy enthusiasm, Carol soon became involved in her first significant philanthropic challenge - saving the Hollywood Bowl (which had filed for bankruptcy in 1951). Carol worked behind the scenes as the volunteer coordinator and later as a Board Member to support the efforts of Dorothy Chandler. They found support from varied businesses and individuals in Los Angeles to resurrect this important L.A. cultural venue. Carol then began her work, from concept to realization, on the development the Performing Arts Center of Los Angeles County (at that time it included the Dorothy Chandler Pavilion, Ahmanson Theater and Mark Taper Forum) - again working with Dorothy Chandler. Carol focused on public relations and fundraising, including the Opera Ball for the Music Center.

Carol has many other interests, including politics. She worked with the LA County Central Committee for the Republican Party especially during the Eisenhower presidential campaign when she organized the party's research library and coordinated all the speaking engagements in Southern California.

In her "spare time" Carol also got her California real estate license and worked for many years with her father, developing and managing the vast array of real estate holdings that began with the family's various nursery properties.

In September of 1966 Carol married John Richards of Long Beach. She embraced his son John Jr. and continues to enjoy their three grandchildren Elizabeth, John III and Alison and their children. Carol soon became involved in her new home city, particularly the Long Beach Opera ("LBO") and the University Art Museum at Cal State University Long Beach. The gentleman leading us in music and song today, Andreas Mitisek, has been the Artistic Director of LBO for many years and their close friendship was through their mutual work with that avant-garde opera company.

Carol initially was a "friend " of the General Phineas Banning Residence Museum, in Wilmington, CA (not far from the Port of Los Angeles) thanks to her childhood friend Nancy Banning Call. Carol was fascinated by the historic aspect of the home turned museum, possibly because of the restoration of this house and grounds. Beginning in the 1970's, as a guest at various museum events, then as a Friends Board member and after as an emeritus Board Member, Carol has always been an enthusiastic supporter of the museum's many programs and preservation efforts. In honor of their father, Carol and her sister Allie Howard Gorham - made possible the restoration of the wisteria and rose gardens next the barn - now the Howard Rose Garden - a lovely quiet oasis on this busy museum campus. In November of 2004 Carol moved south to Aliso Viejo, in Orange County, CA and into a beautiful residential development called The Covington ("Cottage 17A"). To her pleasant surprise there were a good number of neighbors that were also from Los Angeles (and a few she knew from years past!). Her time here was a joy. Nesa Thompson looked after her health and medical needs and Katie Ruiz made sure Carol's finances were in good shape. They were and remain very close to Carol. They were ever more important in her life in her later years. The Richards, Thompson and Armstrong families, Katie, Stan and many others have shared many wonderful times with Carol at The Covington. "Father Rick" as she called him, became a source of strength in recent years. Last but certainly not least, Carol had loving care in recent times. Along with Nesa and Albert Thompson, Cynthia Grant, Vicki Golez, Melinda Nueda, Joy Alonalon, Luida Alcausin and Susan Banawa were at her side 24/7 making sure all her needs were met....and always with a smile \bigcirc .
